The Commonweal is the only theatre company in North America with an annual commitment to producing the works of Henrik Ibsen, the Father of Modern Drama. Since 1998, the theatre has opened each season with a work from his canon and celebrates this tradition with the Ibsen Festival – a weekend of events featuring Scandinavian theatre, visual art, music and dance.

The Commonweal Theatre has been internationally recognized for their Ibsen work. In 2008, the Commonweal was one of only four theatre companies in the world to receive an International Ibsen Scholarship from the Norwegian Ministry of Culture. Company members attended the international Ibsen Festival and Conference in Norway.

In 2009, artistic director Hal Cropp was nominated for the prestigious International Ibsen Award. Established by the Norwegian Parliament, this award honors an individual, organization or institution for exceptional achievements defined within the spirit of Ibsen's work.

The Commonweal also offers an annual Ibsen Elderhostel, as well as programs designed for organizations and cultural groups.

Every other year the company tours the upper Midwest with their current Ibsen production. Last year, the Commonweal performed in nine cities in Minnesota and Wisconsin before bringing *Hedda Gabler* back to Lanesboro for a two month run. The 2011 tour will feature *An Enemy of the People*.
